### What is Bord Bia Bloom?

Owned and organised by Bord Bia, Bloom is a festival of horticulture, food, drink, and sustainable living which is designed to inspire, educate, entertain, and enthral our 100,000+ visitors.

### Where and when?

The festival takes place each June bank holiday weekend, spanning a 70-acre site in Dublin's leafy Phoenix Park.

### What is the long-term goal of the festival?

To build on the success of Bord Bia Bloom and cement its position as a world-class, uplifting and innovative horticulture, food and drink experience, with nature and sustainable living at its heart. In doing this, we will meet our responsibility to the planet, to society, and to future generations.

### What are the show gardens?

The show gardens and feature gardens are the top attraction at Bord Bia Bloom each year, with over three-quarters of attendees reporting that they are the primary reason they visit the festival.\*

There are between 20 to 23 show gardens and feature gardens on display and the show gardens are split into four categories:
Large, Medium, Small, and Concept. Concept gardens are artistic installations or abstract exhibits, while all other gardens are designed to suit residential gardens or balconies. The feature gardens are special garden displays that are not entered into the show gardens' competition.

### The judging process

The show gardens are rigorously assessed by an independent panel of expert judges over three days leading up to Bloom. They are judged on the execution of the design brief, the overall impression and design, the construction, and the planting. What are the benefits of designing a show garden?

Designing a show garden at Bord Bia Bloom can be hugely beneficial to your career. As a designer you will gain:

Invaluable experience in designing, planning, and building a prestigious show garden

An opportunity to showcase your talent to over 100,000 consumers plus influential media, brands, charities, and state organisations

A platform to test new ideas and techniques

Top quality photography for use in your portfolio

A chance to network with peers in the industry and work with leading landscapers, nurseries, and suppliers



### What does the process involve?

Designing and project managing the creation of a Bord Bia Bloom show garden is a detailed and lengthy project. This begins with the application process and submissions of initial designs in November. Work honing the design and planning the construction and planting will begin in January and continue in the months leading up to Bloom.

The build commences in May and all garden designers must also be present on-site on Bloom's media day and across the five days of the festival. Before applying, please ensure you have the availability and capacity to commit to this project.








Nicola Haines is a landscape designer and winner of multiple awards at Bord Bia Bloom, including a gold medal and the award for 'Best Large Show Garden' for her 'Coming Home to Nature' show garden, sponsored by Fingal County Council, at Bloom 2024. She explains why designing show gardens is so worthwhile.

"Bord Bia Bloom has allowed me to test new materials or explore new design areas which I might not be able to incorporate into my client work. It also allows you to focus on a theme or concept and justify the time researching it, which can only benefit future garden projects. Bloom is also a wonderful opportunity to meet with the public to see what they are interested in.

You can lead an isolated life as a landscape designer but Bloom provides an opportunity to get together with people who are facing the same challenges as you. It always offers a very social, tremendously supportive and encouraging atmosphere. Ireland is a small country and the fact that we have our own national garden show is something to be celebrated. It allows us to have a voice in the sector and be part of the conversation while getting our name out there."

Alan Rudden is a garden designer and horticulturist. He has won numerous awards at Bord Bia Bloom, including seven gold medals. He reveals how Bloom has benefited his business.

"Bord Bia Bloom is an unbelievable platform.

If you have any idea percolating in your head, it gives you the ability to express yourself on a big blank canvas which is not in the real world and so it has no restraints. The whole process is amazing. To be given free rein to be able to express yourself and deliver a design that you want to do... where would you get that exposure or that stage in any other industry? That for me is the big draw at Bloom

There's no doubt about it, people associate a certain level of quality with Bloom and it definitely adds another string to your bow when building your business profile. You get back what you put into anything. A show garden comes with a lot of hard work, but for me it is the foundation of where I've built everything from. The images lend themselves so well to social media platforms such as Instagram and have really helped build our brand. This should be a definite draw for any aspiring designers."

Kathryn Feeley, who designed her first Bord Bia Bloom show garden in 2022, urges other young designers to consider applying for Bloom.

"As a new designer, getting an opportunity to design a show garden was such a great experience. Creatively you get the chance to design something exactly how you want it. This gives you an opportunity to explore your own style and show it to prospective clients.

Real gardens can take time to mature so having a garden ready to photograph has been very helpful for my portfolio. It was also the first time I had the chance to meet so many people in the industry. These were the people I had been coming to see at Bord Bia Bloom for years and now here I was in the middle of them! Designing a show garden for Bloom was stressful, exhausting, but utterly unforgettable and I'd thoroughly recommend it to others."
